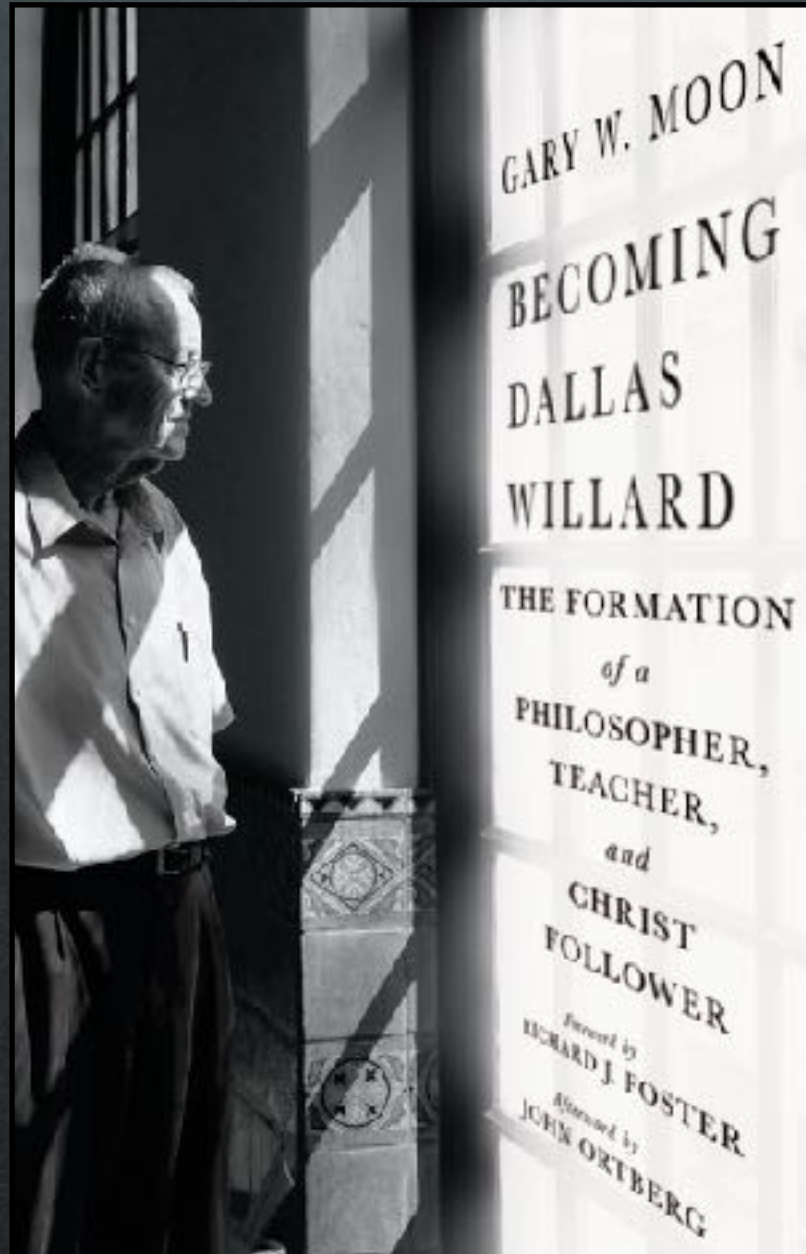

The books, oh the books! How my dream world of childhood was interwoven with far away places real and not, as my intoxication with life flourished. I have been incredibly blessed all my life.

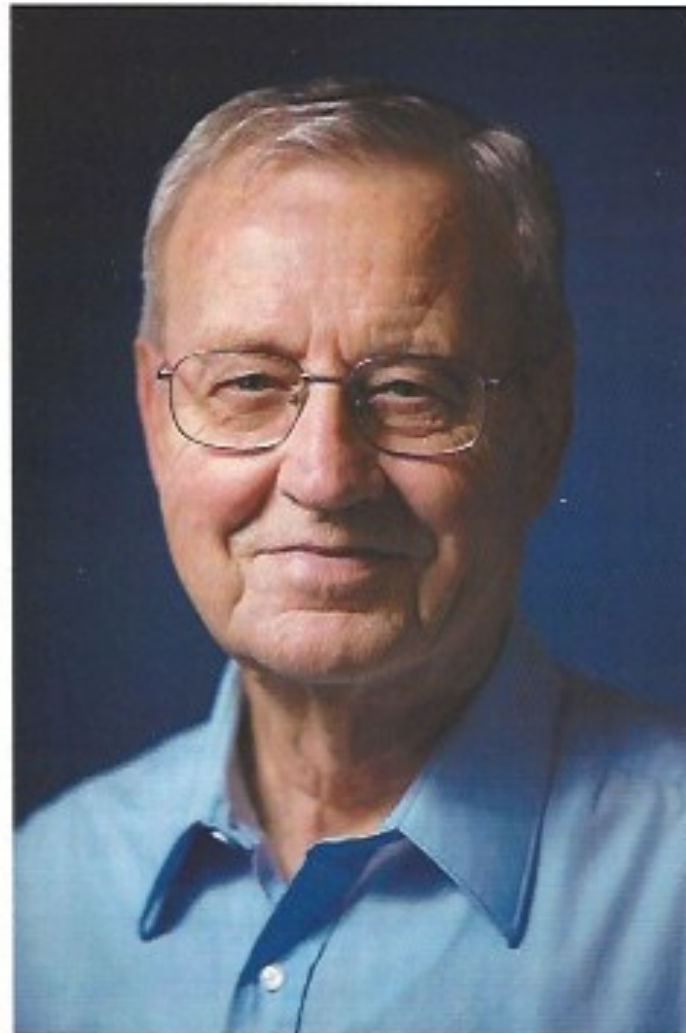

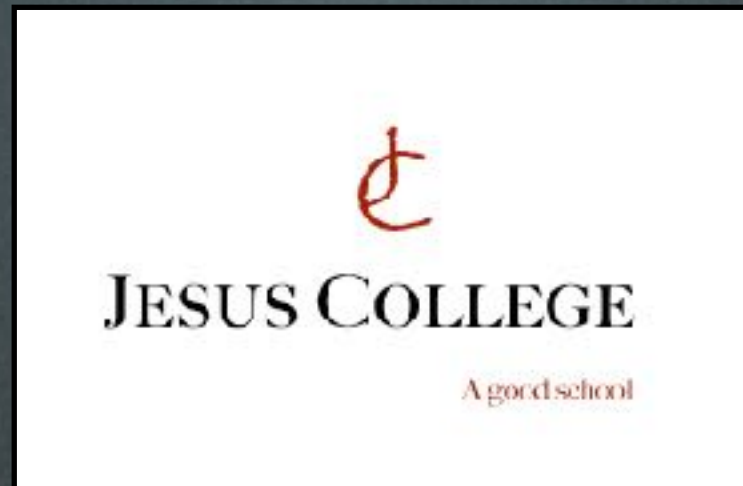
How has the formation of Dallas Willard, his marriage, family, profession, ministry and life influenced who I am becoming?
